Individuals whose applications are approved will be issued Certified Referee credentials (patch and card). The fee for Referee Certification is 20.00. Certification will be good for a period of three (3) years ending on December 31 of the  $3^{rd}$  year of certification.

The examination poses questions about new rules, the most common occurrences and about situations that seem to give referees the most problem. Questions will be added or revised as rules change.

- 1. In a two shot single target presentation, if the target is missed with the first shot and an ammo or gun malfunction occurs, preventing the second shot from being fired, the target will be re-attempted. The shooter must intentionally miss the target on the first shot. The second shot will count for either dead or lost. If the shooter breaks the target on the first shot in this scenario the target will be scored as lost.
