NSCA Hall of Fame

Induction into the NSCA Hall of Fame is the highest honor any Sporting Clays shooter can receive from the association. The NSCA Hall of Fame Committee, appointed by the NSCA Executive Council, is charged by the Executive Council to annually nominate those individuals the committee deems worthy of consideration for induction into the NSCA Hall of Fame. Hall of Fame consideration will come from submissions by the NSCA membership and the NSCA Hall of Fame Committee. Any member in good standing with the NSCA may submit a candidate for consideration by the NSCA Hall of Fame Committee.

Hall of Fame candidates are selected from three groups: Candidates who have made impressive records shooting; persons who have made significant contributions to the NSCA and the sport (*the Hal du Pont Jr. Service Award*), and persons who have made significant contributions to the involvement and development of youth shooters in the sport benefiting the NSCA (*the Hill-Adams Service Award*).

Candidates become eligible for selection after 10 years of active membership in the NSCA. (*An exception can be granted for the 10 years active membership criteria by the Hall of Fame Committee due to death, illness, disability or any other factor deemed suitable by the Committee.*)

Submission Procedures

The procedure for nominating a candidate will be published annually in the November issue of the Sporting Clays Magazine or found on the NSCA website. Submissions should be mailed to NSCA Headquarters using the Candidate Nomination Form (made available by request from Headquarters, or download below.)

The deadline for submission to Headquarters shall be April, 1st of the year of induction consideration. All nominations submitted will be reviewed and consideration will be given for a period of three years, after which the nomination will be removed and must be re-submitted for future consideration.

NSCA Headquarters will forward all submissions to the Hall of Fame Committee Chairman no later than the second Monday in April. All submissions that are made by the Hall of Fame Committee will be combined with the submissions from the NSCA membership-at-large and distributed to all Hall of Fame committee members by the Hall of Fame Committee Chairman for consideration no later than April, 31st.

Committee nominations will then be presented to the NSCA Executive Council for vote no later than May, 1st of that induction year.

I am honored to nominate two time NSCA National Champion, Robert J. (Robbie) Purser for the NSCA Hall of Fame. Robbie's shooting career began at the age of six, shooting skeet with his Dad at Ocmulgee River Gun Club. He won the club Sub-Junior Championship; at age 7 he won the Georgia State Sub-Junior Championship. From 1967 to 1988 he won multiple state and national titles (he broke the First registered 100 x 100 doubles championship at Forest City Gun Club).

Robbie started shooting sporting clays in 1987; his mentor/instructor was Gale Davis, a member of the first US Shooting Team. In 1991, he won his first NSCA National Championship and a second NSCA National Championship in 1998. Please review and consider the attached nomination form which details some of the highlights of this Champion's shooting career. Stroik Named *The Clay Pigeon* Shooting Sportsman of 1999



When Ed Stroik was notified that he had been voted as our Shooting Sportsman of the Year, his gracious reply began with an expression of his honor and gratitude. He continued by commenting on the pride he felt at having been nominated in the company of such distinguished gentlemen as Gil Ash, Bruce Barsoni, and Hugh Sosebee, Jr. Such eloquence is reason enough to confirm that the enthusiasm our readers brought to this contest was well deserved, not only by our winner but by all of our nominees.

Stroik was introduced to sporting clays in 1993 during an outing sponsored by

"Trump Castle Casino" in West Creek, New Jersey, where he first won a team award. Following a "salad" demonstration by J. Saterwaite, he was hooked.

In 1993, he sold his business, retired, and began to participate in sporting clays tournaments for recreation. When certain infirmities precluded live game hunting, he took a few lessons and was coached by the many wonderful shooter friends he met along the way.

With equal parts commitment and enthusiasm, Ed went on to become a part of the All-American Sporting Clays Team in 1997, 1998, and 1999. In 1998, he was named an alternate on the All-American Super Vet FTASC Team. In Pennsylvania, where he makes his home, Ed was state veteran champion in 1997 and 1999, as well as second high volume shooter in 1997 and 1998.

With less than ten years' involvement in the sport, Ed has attended the Nationals for five years and has participated in tournaments throughout the country. He humbly admits, "I feel a responsibility to give back something to a sport that has given me and my wife so much enjoyment. To this end, we co-sponsor certain tournaments whenever possible."

Ed will be presented the award at the Pennsylvania State Shoot in July, and we now add his name to a tradition of recognizing those shooting sportsmen who have added another dimension to the game by their dedication to and delight in the sport.

Mr. Parsons has been in the service of the sporting clays community since the sport traveled across the Atlantic and the cornerstone for the American sporting clays industry was laid. From its inception, the sport sought and required legitimacy to succeed as had the disciplines of trap and skeet before it. To aid in that effort, Parsons organized and trained individuals in the rules of eight different disciplines of the clay target games. To develop standards of excellence Parsons developed and implemented a written test to provide a foundation of knowledge among sporting clays referees. As a result of his efforts, qualified referees became available for certified events and provided consistency and continuity across the country, wherever registered events were held.

In addition to training and supervising others, Parsons was, and is, known as an exceptional FITASC referee. In that capacity he represented the United States in refereeing the 1998, 2002, and 2003 World FITASC Championships. Additionally Parsons staffed and supervised the personnel who served as referees at numerous major national and international competitions including National and World English Championships.

Expanding his abilities to serve the sport, Parsons mastered the skills of target setting, and his services were requested at numerous state, zone, regional, World English and US Open FITASC championships. His hard work and expertise were awarded when he was named one of eight course designers for the 2003 World FITASC Championship.

Parson's exhibited yet another skill set as a participant in the sport. His skill as a shooter culminated in his achieving the status of Master Class. His success as a shooter led him to develop his abilities as an instructor and being awarded on the basis of ability, the highest National Sporting Clays Association Instructor certification. Again utilizing his talents to serve the sport, Parsons used his Level III coaching certification to teach hundreds of novice, intermediate, and experienced shooters.

Mr. Parsons also served the National Sporting Clays Association as Personnel Manager from 2000-2006. His duties included staffing seven successful National Championship events and four World English Championships as well as numerous smaller competitive and corporate events.

Following his service as NSCA Personnel Manager, Parsons served as President and COO of American Shooting Center in Houston 2006-2008 where he supervised and hosted the 2007 Texas State Sporting Clays Championship.
