Corrections to wrong answers must be made by the applicant under the guidance of the examining officer.

Individuals whose applications are approved will be issued Certified Referee credentials (patch and card). The fee for Referee Certification is \$20.00 and certification will be good for a period of three (3) years ending on December 31 of the 3rd year of certification.

The examination poses questions about new rules, the most common occurrences, and about situations that seem to give referees the most problems. Questions will be added or revised as rules change.

If you are teaching a class, please return all completed applications and exams you administered with your fee for the total amount to NSC A Headquarters for approval. NSCA will process the applications upon receiving all necessary documents and the necessary fees and will then forward each applicant credentials as a Certified Referee.
