



## **2026 CERTIFIED REFEREE'S STANDARDIZED EXAMINATION**

January 6, 2026

NSCA referees play a vital role in ensuring fairness, accuracy, and consistency at registered sporting clays events. Certified referees help uphold the integrity of competition by correctly applying NSCA rules, managing scoring procedures, and maintaining a safe, well-run course. While certification is recommended, it is not required to referee at NSCA-sanctioned events.

To become certified as an NSCA Sporting Referee, applicants must pass the open-book NSCA Referee Test and complete the NSCA Referee Application administered by their State Association, an NSCA National Delegate, an NSCA Member Club, or an NSCA Level I, II, or III Instructor. The Referee Certification fee is \$10, and certification is valid for three (3) years, expiring on December 31 of the third year. To remain current with NSCA rules and procedures, referees must renew their certification upon expiration by re-testing and paying the certification fee.

Newly certified referees will receive an NSCA Referee Patch, and an Official Referee Card, recognizing their training and qualification to officiate NSCA-sanctioned events.

If you are teaching a class, please submit all completed applications and exams you administered, along with the total applicable fee, to NSCA Headquarters for approval. Upon receipt of all required documents and fees, NSCA will process the applications and issue Certified Referee credentials to each approved applicant.

# 2026 NSCA CERTIFIED REFEREE STANDARD EXAMINATION

November 15, 2019

1. In a two shot single target presentation, if the target is missed with the first shot and an ammo or gun malfunction occurs, preventing the second shot from being fired, the target will be re-attempted. The shooter must intentionally miss the target on the first shot. The second shot will count for either dead or lost. If the shooter breaks the target on the first shot in this scenario the target will be scored as lost.
