Report Pairs instead of singles on stations 1, 2, 6 and 7 shooting outgoing target first

True Pairs on stations 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 (outgoing target shot first)

Shoot high bird first on station 4 in the first round and low bird first on station 4 in the second round

No singles except on station 8 – 1 high 8 and 2 low 8s (everyone shoots high 8 before shooting low 8)

No option shot

Sporting Clays rules apply:

1 – 3 seconds to pull

Report pair and true pair sporting rules apply

Hitting both targets with one shot on a true pair (clubhouse) is allowed

Hone your skills for any shooting discipline with this quicker paced version of skeet that utilizes the skeet pads and shooting angles for a fun outing at the range!



SPORT SKEET – EVENT DETAILS & FAQs

What is Sport Skeet?

Sport Skeet is an exciting, fast-paced variation of the traditional Skeet event that blends the familiar format of Skeet with the rules of Sporting Clays. It's a fun and challenging event designed for all skill levels.

When is the event held?

This event will take place daily from Friday April 24th through Sunday April 26th, totaling 3 separate events. Winners will be determined daily, so participants have multiple chances to win! Overall HOA will be highest score out of all three days.

What is the cost to participate?

Entry is \$50 per event for a total of 50 Targets.

How will the event be scored and awarded?

Each day, all shooters' scores will be grouped into Lewis Classes based on total participation.

- 1–20 participants: 2 Lewis Classes
- 21+ participants: 3 Lewis Classes

Scores will be sorted, and winners will be determined within each class. 3 places per class will be awarded. Your highest score of the day will be used, and you can only win in one class per day, even if you shoot multiple times. Overall HOA will be highest score out of all three days.

Can someone enter more than once?

Yes, shooters may enter multiple times per day. However, only their highest score of the day will count toward awards, and they are only eligible to win in one class per day.

Will there be referees?

Yes. There will be a referee on each field. Additionally, an information sheet with details about the event and rules will be available in the Pro-Shop, and signs will be posted on the field to guide you through each station.

What prizes are offered?

National Shooting Complex giftcards for targets, ammo, general store, or entry fees for future NSC events. Prizes can be picked up the following day at the registration building. Prizes will be limited to one person in each class. Ties will be broken by Shoot Administration using standard methods (long-run, coin flip, etc.).
